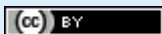
### GUIDELINES ON HOW TO CONDUCT COURSES

This section describes the activities you must complete to finish one or both courses and earn a certificate.

Both courses include analysis of theoretical readings, video watching, and the final self-assessment quizzes. After you conduct all tasks, you will be requested to deliver a final collaborative assignment, questions, and self-assessment quizzes.

At the end of each lesson, you can share your experience and ideas in a discussion forum. Please check the symbols below to help you follow the module's structure.

	Read theoretical introductions, articles, and chapters
	Watch video recordings where international experts introduce or share insights on a particular topic
	Explore the infographics, tables and figures that provide more structured information on a given topic
	Reflect on given questions to find ways how to improve your teaching and learning practice
	Self-assess your learning and understanding of the topic
	Share and discuss your ideas and experiences on a given question in a discussion forum
	Additional resources are optional for you to analyse and study the topic more explicitly.



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## SELF-ASSESSMENT AND FINAL QUIZZES

For consistent learning progress, each lesson ends with a **self-assessment quiz** that includes 7 multiple-choice. These quizzes are for self-assessment, and scores are not calculated. We recommend taking these quizzes since we might incorporate some of them into the final quiz.

The **final quiz** will help you to self-assess your learning and overall understanding of training content. The final quiz has 15 multiple-choice questions. You can take the quiz as many times as you need to.

To earn a **Certificate of Attendance**, you must score at least 12 out of 15 points (80% of total points).

To earn a **Certificate of Achievement**, you will need to complete a self-assessment quiz (score with at least 12 points, 80%, of total points) and deliver the final collaborative assignment (described below) in the form of an OER.

## FINAL COLLABORATIVE ASSIGNMENT

The final assignment in this cluster is ***to create an OER in collaboration with other course participants.***

The assignment is to **create an OER in the scope of 1000 words.**

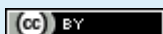

## CERTIFICATES

Two types of certificates can be issued at the end of the course:

<b>Certificate of Attendance</b>	This certificate confirms that the student has <b><i>taken the course, studied the course material, and passed the final quiz</i></b> with a minimum score of 80%.
<b>Certificate of Achievement</b>	This certificate confirms that the student has <b><i>completed the final quiz</i></b> with a minimum score of 80% and <b><i>completed the final collaborative assignment.</i></b>
